Sports Jam Sessions Weekly professional coaching sessions delivered to Nursery, EYFS, KS1 and KS2	£2730	To provide quality PE coaching throughout the year; covering a range of sports.	The children had a rich variety of sports coaching; timetabled to link with sports festivals held each half term. This has had a positive impact on their level of fitness and well being. The children really look forward to their weekly sessions. Feedback from parents is very positive. EYFS staff have gained valuable CPD working alongside the sports coach. This has had a positive impact on their physical development and enabled quality observation of physical development.
After School Sports Club run by professional sports coach and supported by TA	£800	To provide an after school sports club to encourage children to further improve their skills.	Facilities for local children are available at Bishops Castle with some children attending football, hockey and tennis clubs. School wants to ensure that all children have a chance for additional sport each week. An increasing number of children live in the village and would have easy access without the need for transport.

Swimming for KS1/KS2 (10 sessions)	£2362	Enable whole school to attend swimming sessions for 10 weeks	Children have gained skills with many receiving swimming certificates. Great for self esteem and confidence – alongside safety aspect of learning to swim and getting good exercise. Having ten weeks for all children has meant that the children have been able to make significant progress. We employ our own professional swimming coach to lead these sessions and keep the quality high. Additional teaching assistants accompany the children and support vulnerable children in the water. Feedback from parents is

			very positive and they appreciate the extended block of lessons available to all children from Reception to Year 6. The annual swimming gala is a cluster event that our KS2 children take part in. A cluster Aqua event is held for Year 2 children.
Chance to Shine Cricket Coaching	£200	Enable children to receive expert cricket coaching.	Children respond well to their cricket coach and are able to build on their skills from last season. The cluster of schools also buys into this provision and the final competition really celebrates the children's skills.
Additional forest leader to lead provision for KS1 and Nursery in the spring and summer terms	£2,000	To enable Nursery and Reception to access forest school provision	Continue the quality provision for the children. This impacts on their physical development and personal, social and emotional development in particular. These sessions allow the children to work in the outdoor environment developing their resilience and allowing carefully managed risk taking.
