Impact of Pupil Premium spending 2013-14

The impact of interventions is closely monitored by teachers on a day to day basis as teachers evaluate and annotate their planning and assess the work of the children as the week progresses. The senior leadership and governors then review progress. This impact is not only academic but also can be seen in a number of ways including;

- Positive impact on the children's self-confidence and self-esteem
- Resulting improvement in learning behaviours
- Curriculum experiences enhanced to allow for greater level of engagement in a wider range of activities
